A Practical Land Stewardship Learning Path

Use the guide as a starting point and adapt each step to your property, ownership structure and long-term goals.

Step	Focus	Suggested action
1	Protect the family legacy	Learn about estate planning, probate and heirs' property. Clarify ownership and consult a qualified attorney when legal guidance is needed.
2	Understand the land	Gather deeds, surveys, tax records, maps and available property history. Identify current conditions, access and known concerns.
3	Explore sustainable forestry	Attend landowner education and request assistance from qualified forestry professionals before making timber-management decisions.
4	Request professional site evaluations	Consider forestry, boundary, soil, septic, environmental and infrastructure evaluations appropriate to the property.
5	Study local development requirements	Review applicable zoning, subdivision, access, stormwater, floodplain and permitting requirements with the appropriate county or municipality.
6	Create a responsible action plan	Sequence decisions, document professional recommendations, estimate costs and preserve records for future generations.
